DR. P. K. HALDAR
(1901-1976)

Dr Haldar passed his DMRE in 1941 and joined S.N.College , Agra as a lecturer . After three years of his service, he was called upon to serve the Indian Army as radiologist as a Major in IAMC. In 1946 , after his release from the army , he joined his parent service. In 1949 he took charge of the department of radiology at S.N.Medical college and L.P.Radium Institute Agra as a Reader and later as a Professor of Radiology . In 1966 , he left S.N.Medical College and joined All India institute of Medical sciences , New Delhi where he served for three years as Prof. of radiology . In1970 he was called back by the state government to organize the Cancer Institute at Kanpur and join as Prof and head of the Department of Radiology at GSVM Medical College Kanpur. He was devoting most of his time in developing this institution and forming nucleus for the most modern teaching and research centre.

Dr Haldar has played a great role in organizing the teaching and research work in India .He was called upon many times by WHO, in 1969. He was the president of IRA. In 1971 he was the president of 24th Indian Congress of Radiology, Kolkata. Dr Haldar has written many academic papers in Radiology and was advisor to ICMR on cancer. Dr Haldar attended International Congress of Radiology at Montreal and at Rome in 1965. He also attended 12th International Congress of Radiology at Tokyo in 1969. In 1971 Dr Haldar was invited to give the prestigious Sir Jagdish Chandra Bose Memorial Lecture at



**DR. SOLOMON PADAM SINGH
(1921-1978)**

Dr Padam Singh was born in February 1921 at Bangalore. He graduated from Andhra Medical College in 1955 and later joined the Christian Medical College , Vellore as house Surgeon . In 1961 he left for U.K and started working as Registrar in Hammersmith Hospital and obtained a DMRT and FFR during the five year period of his training. In 1966 he returned to CMC, Vellore and worked as a Reader in the Radiotherapy department.

In 1967, he took charge of the department and was instrumental in starting DMRT and MD training in Madras University and the M.S.R course at CMCH , Vellore , awarded from U.K.

In 1969 he was promoted as Professor. In 1976 he relinquished the post of the Head of the Department for health reasons and settled in Bangalore continuing his service for establishment of the Bangalore Medical Trust for cancer patients

Dr Padam Singh's enthusiasm for every thing in the Radiotherapy department was highly inspiring to his colleagues. His concern for patients was exemplary. He had all the hallmarks of a successful doctor. As a doctor, he had the ability to establish rapport with patients as a diagnostician and as a therapist. He had immense experience with orthovoltage X-ray and Brachytherapy. His students remember him for his humanity and outstanding guidance as a teacher and for interdisciplinary clinics in the treatment of malignant diseases, as the foresight to plan for the future. He was instrumental in obtaining a 42 Mev BETATRON, the first machine of its kind to be operational in South East Asia, which was commissioned in 1978. He was also instrumental in substituting radium with cesium 137 tubes and needles from Amersham, England in 1975 at CMC for the first time in India

Dr Solomon Padam Singh passed away on October 10th 1978 in Bangalore after a brief illness.



DR. RANGI PRASAD SINGH
(26/02/1926- 8/12/2001)

Prof. Dr Rangi Prasad Singh was the pioneer in the field of oncology in Bihar . He nurtured the Prince Wales Medical College based Radium Institute of Patna from its nascent stage in the 1960's to a stage when it was transformed into a premier Oncology centre in Eastern India , as Professor and head of the department.

He graduated from the Prince of Wales medical College in 1952 and obtained his M.S.(Gen Surg.) in 1958 and M.D.(Rad.)in 1965. He obtained his DMRT from Middlesex Hospital , London in 1970 and was associated with Hammersmith cancer Institute , Royal Marsden Hospital and Holt Radium Institute, Manchester. He was fellow of the Royal Society and Royal College of Physicians , London. He was fellow of the Indian College of Radiology.

During his illustrious career he adorned several posts in all fields. He was President IMA Bihar, President Bihar State Radiological Association, Founder president AROI Bihar Chapter , Senior Vice President of the Indian Radiological and Imagine Association (IRIA), President , Bihar state health services Association and Vice President of Bihar Literary Forum . He was visiting Professor at the Howard University Hospital, Washington and National Institute of Health Bethesda, U.S.A.

In the literary field he has over a dozen publications both medical and non-medical; to his credit He was Vice President Akhil Bhartiya Bhasha Sahitya Sammelan.

It will be an exercise in futility to entirely dimensionless the influence of his gentle personality, but in his demise it is indeed profound. He was a great son of the soil, a self made man, and simple in taste



DR. G. C. PANT
(28/1/1936-15/6/2002)

Prof. Girish Chandra Pant, popular as Girish or Pant, amongst his friends & seniors, completed his MBBS from King George's Medical College (KGMC) , Lucknow in 1960 , DMRE in 1962 and MD (Radiology-combined diagnosis & therapy) in 1964 . He began his professional career as Assistant Radiotherapist at KGMC in 1964. In 1965 he moved to the Institute of Medical Sciences, Banaras Hindu University & along with Prof. A.D Singh, was instrumental in building up the Department of Radiotherapy at BHU. He also took up the task, along with his colleagues there, in starting the courses of DMRD and subsequently MD (Radiotherapy) at BHU. He has been one of the founder members of the Association of Radiation Oncologists of India, founder member of the Indian College of Radiation Oncology and member of the first executive body of AROI. Prof Pant took up the initiative in organizing the second Annual conference of AROI at Varanasi in 1978 and has made an important contribution to the growth of the association & the specialty in the country.

Prof. Pant was the Dean, faculty of Medicine of Banaras Hindu University and acting Vice –Chancellor of BHU from June 13,1993 to Dec 13,1993. He retired form active service from BHU on January 31,1996 & spent his retired life doing voluntary medical and social service at Varanasi

It is an irony of fate that the man who spent his life fighting against the dreaded disease “Cancer” fell a victim to this very disease. In May 2001, Prof. Pant was diagnosed to be having a brain tumor that subsequently turned out to be Glioblastoma Multiforme of the right frontal lobe of the brain. He was operated, received chemotherapy and was well for a while. Then again in early 2002, began a down hill course and he breathed his last in the evening of June 15,2002. Thus came the end to an illustrious career of an excellent medical man who rose to eminence as a direct result of his own hard work and who brought excellent fortune to all those who have interacted with him not only his professional capacity but also in his personal life.

Prescripts

- All time frame for age limit to be taken as on 'last day of the conference year' i.e. for 2008 Conference the age limit to be reckoned from 31.12.2008.
- All applicants should personally be present at the AROI annual conference where the fellowships are awarded. The fellowships will not be awarded in absentia (The radiotherapy technologists -RTT are exempted for this criterion).
- Candidates will not be eligible for another AROI fellowship for minimum of five years after any one fellowship has been awarded.

2. Age more than 31 years but not less than 40 years
3. Possessing MD, DNB (Radiotherapy) or equivalent degree
4. Full time practicing in Radiation Oncology
5. Preferably applicant is regular in attending the AROI conferences.
6. Preference will be given to persons having published scientific paper/s in peer reviewed

journals or presentation of paper in previous AROI conferences.

How to apply:

1. Applications will be invited along with other fellowships, by the Secretary General prior to the annual conference of AROI.
2. The applicant should submit paper for poster presentation at AROI annual conference.
3. The applicant should submit a letter from his/her, Head of the Institution / Head of the Department accepting to relieve the candidate, if selected for fellowship.

Selection procedure:

1. Selection will be done through a selection committee appointed by the President & Secretary General of AROI during the AROI annual conference.
2. The committee will scrutinize the applications and can award on the basis of poster/oral presentation during the conference.
