UDAIPUR ATTRACTION



PRATAP SMARAK : Located on the top of Moti Margi or Pearl Hill, which was built-in the 18th century. One of the most thrilling features of the Memorial is a life-sized bronze statue of Maharana Pratap sitting on his faithful horse, Chetak. The figure is 11 feet high and weighs about 70 tonnes. The museum built on the premises of the Memorial has an enormous collection of paintings. These paintings depict the rich history of Kumbhalgarh and Chittorgarh along with the few instances from the battle of Haldighati.

CITY PALACE : The city palace towers over Lake Pichola. The balconies, cupolas and towers of the palace give a wonderful view of the lake and the surrounding city. This complex actually consists of four major and several minor palaces that collectively form the magnificent City Palace. The main part of the palace is now preserved as a museum displaying artifacts.



SAJJAN GARH FORT : Situated just outside Udaipur, this 19th century palace is built on top of Bansdara hills. Used as a monsoon palace and hunting lodge, built by Maharana Sajjan Singh. It is an awe-inspiring sight on Udaipur skyline and offer spectacular views of city and area around.

LAKE PALACE : Now a globally famous hotel but was originally called Jagniwas and served as a summer palace. Built between 1743 and 1746 on the island near Jagmandir in Lake Pichola. The palace faces east and is a wondrous sight to behold.



FATEH SAGAR LAKE : This delightful lake, bordered by hills and woodlands, lies to the north of Lake Pichola. The lake houses the beautiful Nehru Island as well as an Island on which stands the Udaipur solar observatory. Boating in the lake gives an immense pleasure and relaxation. The largest fish aquarium in India, UNDER THE SUN is situated close to the Lake Fatehsagar Paal.

SUKHADIA CIRCLE : Sukhadia circle lies to north of Udaipur. It comprises a small pond that also houses a 21 foot tall, three-tiered marble fountain. Decorated with beautifully carved motifs, the fountain looks spectacular at night when it lit up. The fountain is surrounded by gardens, creating a perfect oasis in a city bustling with tourists.

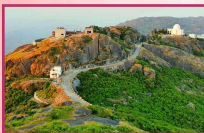


KUMBHALGARH : Kumbhalgarh also known as the Great Wall of India is a Mewar fortress on the westerly range of Aravalli Hills, in the Rajsamand district near Udaipur of Rajasthan state in western India. It is the second-longest wall of the world after the Great Wall of China. In 2013, at the 37th session of the World Heritage Committee held in Phnom Penh, Cambodia, Kumbhalgarh Fort, along with five other forts of Rajasthan, was declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site under the group Hill Forts of Rajasthan.

Distance from Udaipur : 84 km

RANAKPUR : Ranakpur is a village located in Desuri tehsil near Sadri town in the Pali district of Rajasthan in western India. It is located between Jodhpur and Udaipur in a valley on the western side of the Aravalli Range. Ranakpur is widely known for its marble Jain temple, said to be the most spectacular of the Jain temples. There is also a small Sun temple which is managed by the Udaipur royal family trust.

Distance from Udaipur: 91 km

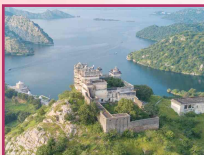


MOUNT ABU : Mount Abu is a hill station in western India's Rajasthan state, near the Gujarat border. Set on a high rocky plateau in the Aravalli Range and surrounded by forest, it offers a relatively cool climate and views over the arid plains below. In the center of town, Nakki Lake is a popular spot for boating. Close by are the centuries-old Dilwara Temples, ornately carved from white marble and of great spiritual importance.

Distance from Udaipur : 163 km

NATHDWARA : Nathdwara is a city in the western state of Rajasthan, India. It is located in the Aravalli hills, on the banks of the Banas River in Rajsamand District. Shrinathji, a swarup of lord Krishna which resembles his 7-year-old "infant" incarnation of Krishna. Nathdwara is a significant Vaishnavite shrine pertaining to the Pushti Marg or the Vallabh Sampradaya or the Shuddha Advaita founded by Vallabh Acharya, revered mainly by people of Gujarat and Rajasthan, among others. Vitthal Nathji, son of Vallabhacharya institutionalised the worship of Shrinathji at Nathdwara.

Distance from Udaipur : 45 km



JAISAMAND LAKE : Jaisamand Lake, also known as Dhebar Lake, is a manmade lake situated in the Udaipur district of Rajasthan. It is India's second-largest artificial lake after Govind Ballabh Pant Sagar, and among the major places to visit as part of Udaipur tour packages. Maharana Jai Singh built Jaisamand Lake in 1685 AD while building a dam over the Gomati River. The statistics of the lake are 14 km in length, 9 km in width, and 102 feet in depth. The lake has a circumference of 30 miles.

Distance from Udaipur : 58 km
