Minutes of GBM 29 Nov. 2008, Nehru Centre, Worli, Mumbai

Annual Conference of AROI 2008: Maharashtra Chapter of AROI and Tata Memorial Hospital, Mumbai 27-30 November 2008 held at Nehru Centre, Worli, Mumbai Proceeding of the general body meeting (GBM) held on Saturday, November 29, 2008

- * Meeting started at 6:30 p.m. as scheduled.
- * The two minute silence was kept for persons lost their life in recent terrorist attack, may their soul rest in peace.
- * Meeting initiated with short address by the president, thanking the co-operation and contribution of members of AROI.
- * The mementoes were distributed to executive members and the winners Dr. MC Pant was Honored for being bestowed wit Padmashree and the conferred with Doctor of Science.
- * The Minutes of the meeting of 2007 were presented by Dr Shrivastava. All aspects were accepted:Proposed by Dr KK Singh & seconded by Dr JK Singh.
- * The number of life members of AROI have reached the members 1200 marks. The List of new numbers was Proposed by Dr. RK Katiyar & Seconded by Dr.V. Sharma.
- * Dr. Rajesh Vashistha mentioned that the Member directory and the membership certificated has been distributed to all members. He reiterated that if any members has failed to may receive these mau informed him he will send them by post. All the executive committee members were requested has not received the certificate / Directory, it should be brought into the notice of Secretary Gneral, AROI so that arrangement can be made to dispatch the same at the earliest.
- * Dr. Shrivastava mentioned that the members should update their address details at AROI website, www.aroi.org, The bers are advised to change their password for viewing the 'members area'. Members can send the email to another AROI members through the aroi website, Any suggestion improving website is welcome.
- * The MCI announcement regarding the practice of chemotherapy by Radiation Oncology was discussed. Regarding The Change Of Name Of Orations & Guest papers, need was felt to make an amendment in AROI constitution. For this purposr a committee needs to be formulated upon whose recommendations, the proposed changes can be discussed & implemented.
- * The account of the year 2008 was presented by Dr. Vashistha. Due to paucity of time and late receipt of the statement we could not circulate the statement of account prior to the annual conference. Proposed by Dr. JK Singh and Seconded by Dr R Sarin.
- * The accounts of ICRO shoul not be presented, it was mentioned that there was no transaction for ICRO in 2008. It was mentioned y Dr. SC Sharma that few FDs are are transfer from Chandigarh. These need to operated by Dr. Senapati (elected as Secretary of ICRO for 2009-2010) Dr. Mahajan suggested that FD may be incorporated in a separate accounts within the AROI account. This can be operated without problems. The account may be under the name of 'AROI-ICRO'. Dr. Vijay Anand Reddy should handover the FD etc. to Dr. Vashistha
- * The JCRT was discussed by dr. Rajiv Sarin. he mentioned that the articals need to be submitted from all over country. Also the message should be passed to the vendors to support the journal And The Funds Collection Should not only be theresponsibility of the editors but also all AROI

- members collectively put efforts.
- * Dr. Munnuswamy mentioned that the sentence "official Journal of AROI" should appear on front page. It was clarified that this is currently present.
- * Dr. Rajesh Vashistha asked the house if Khanna Travels may be continued to be official travel agent for AROI. This year onwards the travel for all fellowships will be organised by official travel agent of AROI. The possible concession should be passed to the AROI accounts. he proposed by Dr. KK Shing and seconded by dr jk singh. President & General Secretary informed the house that during the previous GBM, it was approved to provide Registration formalities & Local Hospitality to the past presidents & General Secretary by the organizing committee. It was not documented at that time. Dr. K.K. Singh proposed the same & Dr. J.K. Singh seconded the same. The house resoled to approve the same & decided to continue the same.
- * The audited accounts of AROI-2007 at Chennai could not be presented as Dr. Jagadeesan /Dr. Bhoopal could not attend the conference. It was proposed to send request to prof. jagadeesan to expedite the report and send to Secretary General. along with the contribution from AROICON 2007as per AROI constitution so that the association activity can maintained smoothly.
- * The AROICON-2009: To be Held at Hyderabad. Dr. Srikanta announced that the registration fee to remain same as that of AROICON-2008 held at Mumbai. This was passed and accepted by the general body. Proposed by Dr. KA Dinshaw seconded by DR. JK Singh.
- * As was suggested to form a committee for drafting the scientific program for the AROI annuak conference. This will improve the scientific contents of the meeting and wil involvemembers at national level. This practice is being adopted by many international organizations such as ASCO, ESTRO, AMPI ets. the following should constitute the committee

- * Dr. Pramod appreciated the involvement of AMPI in the ongoing conference, however Dr. F. Patel suggested to avoid the overlap of the two conferences.
- * Dr. Kanan inquired regarding the necessity of sending the preferred papers for screeing to the members. From AROICON 2008, Nehru Centre, Worli, Mumbai, 27th to 30th November 2008

The 30 Annual Conference of the Association of Radiation Oncologists of India was organized by the Maharashtra chapter of AROI in collaboration with the TMH from the 27 to 30 November 2008. The conference venue was the historic "Nehru Centre" located adjacent to the Worli seafront.

The preparations for AROICON 2008, Mumbai started with the first meeting of the local organizing committee on the 24 November 2007 at TMH. It was a consensus in the first meeting that the primary focus of the committee would be to have an excellent scientific program in a state of the convention centre that was centrally located within the city. Another focus was to keep the conference cost to as low as possible which meant that the conference needed to be without frills and at the same time be fruitful and enjoyable.

The conference theme was "Beyond Isodoses" that highlighted the essence of the conference which was to discuss radiation therapy in cancer treatment in the backdrop of modern day multimodality cancer management with topics ranging form "Screening to Prevention", "Cure to Palliation", "Biology to Technology", & "Hypothesis to Philosophy".

The primary focus in formulating the scientific program was to be able to cover the entire spectrum of applications of radiation therapy as part modern cancer management and allow every member an opportunity to showcase and discuss the work that they have been doing in their respective institutions. Efforts were made to keep the number of parallel sessions to the least possible in order to allow delegates to attend most of the sessions of respective interest. Inputs and suggestions regarding the contents of the scientific program and speakers were solicited from members from all over the country. Site/ disease specific symposia's were kept in order to be able t discuss important issues related to the specific topic in detail and in a focus manner. Panel discussions were very useful to address important topical issues and to encourage active participation of delegates in the scientific program. The topics for invited talks were chosen to address aspects of innovations, newer technologies both for external beam radiation therapy an brachytherapy and to critically review their status in modern day radiation therapy. Proffered papers and Poster viewing sessions were primarily aimed at providing a platform for residents and junior faculty to discuss their scientific work at a national forum.

As a tradition, the scientific deliberations for AROICON 2008 started with the ICRO teaching course on the 27 November. This year the theme was "Pediatric Oncology". It was very encouraging to see a large

number of students and faculty actively participating in this day long program that included topics like comprehensive management of Ewing's sarcoma, CNS tumors, High precision techniques, Limb salvage, and Pediatric palliative care. The faculty included Radiation oncologists, Pathologists, Surgeons, & Medical oncologists involved in pediatric cancer management. The highlight of the ICRO program was the ICRO-Quiz that was very interesting and induced a lot of enthusiasm amongst residents in training.

The inauguration ceremony was highlighted by the presence of the chief guest Dr Anil Kakodkar (Chairman, Atomic Energy Commission) and faculty and delegates from within the country and abroad who were there for the conference despite the terrible incidents of terror attacks that struck Mumbai at that time.

Kudos to Dr SK Shrivastava (President AROI) and Dr SK Koul (President AMPI) for bringing the two associations together on a common platform of scientific deliberations for the first time in history. This was marked by a day long scientific program on the 28 November that covered a wide range of topics that were of mutual interest to both radiation oncologists and medical physicists. This common platform induced very interesting discussions that could go a long way in improvement and optimization of fradiation oncology techniques and technology in the country. This would also pave a new road for scientific collaboration between the radiation oncology and medical physics.

The Solomon Padam Singh Oration was delivered by Professor Soren Bentzen from the University of Wisconsin, Madison. In his lecture titled "Radiation Therapy in the Era of Molecular Oncology" Prof. Bentzen took the audience through the journey of evolution of radiation oncology from its early beginnings to the current state of IMRT, IGRT, Dose Painting, and Biological imaging based radiation planning and delivery. The talk was very informative and appreciated by all.

Dr Firuza Patel, Prof. of Radiation Oncology, PGI Chandigarh delivered the "PK Haldar Memorial Oration". Her lecture titled "Evolution of Radiotherapy in Carcinoma Cervix: Down the Memory Lane" was a very interesting and lucid presentation highlighting the development of radiation therapy for carcinoma of cervix both for external beam radiation therapy and Brachytherapy.

The Rangi Prasad Lecture titled "Management of Nasopharyngeal Cancers: An Overview" to be delivered by Dr Tomcha Singh from Imphal had to left undelivered as he was unable to attend the conference due to the terror attacks in Mumbai.

The Keynote lecture by Dr Massoud Samiei from IAEA titled "The









KA Dinshaw, Director, Tata Memorial Centre, delivered a very informative lecture titled "Screening & Early Detection: Lessons Learnt". She elaborated on the role and current status of screening in cancer and its impact on educing cancer mortality. She also highlighted the efforts initiated by the Tata Memorial Centre towards screening & early detection of cancers in India. All three lectures were appreciated by all and possibly would have an impact on the long-term outcome of cancer care in India and the developing world. Adding to the interesting scientific feast were two early morning teaching sessions titled "AROI Grand Round with the Professor". The session on "High Precision Radiotherapy Techniques" by Prof. Michael Brada from the Royal Marsden Hospital, London and Dr. V Kannan from Hinduja Hospital, Mumbai was a feast for the residents who were there in large numbers to grab the opportunity to

Interact with the stalwarts. The second session titled "Fractionation in Radiotherapy" by Prof. Soren Bentzen, and Dr. JP Agarwal from TMH, Mumbai was again a scientific treat and the interest generated was reflected by the fact that the Professors were stumped on many occasions by questions from the floor.

Of the 136 abstracts received for review, thirty-six were selected for proffered paper presentation and the remaining were allocated for poster presentation. The selection of abstracts was based on peer review and structured scoring by a panel of experts from all over the country. The organizing committee would like to thank Dr Nagraj Huilgol, Editor in Chief of the official journal of AROI, JCRT for allowing us to print the conference abstracts as a journal supplement. The Best Paper Session

included 12 presentations of pre-selected full papers that were submitted and peer-reviewed and chosen for the best paper session.

The participation of our colleagues from the trade merits special mention. Besides the financial support from the trade towards organization of the conference, members from trade were present in near full strength all throughout the conference in the trade exhibition area interacting with delegates despite the unfortunate incidents of terror in Mumbai that also took the lives of two of our dear colleagues from Tomotherapy & KTL. One has to mention here that the "Code of Conduct" about do's and dont's during the conference was readily adhered to by all and was exemplary.

Our sincere apologies to the spouses and children of delegates who had come all the way to Mumbai, for being unable to provide the fun and enjoyment that is usually associated with AROI conferences. Although we had organized a wonderful evening for all of us at the sprawling "United Services Club" along the seaside, we had to cancel the program because of security reasons. Nevertheless we as the organizers of AROICON 2008, had a wonderful time organizing the conference and having you here with us in Mumbai and hope that you had a fruitful and enjoyable conference too.

Shall look forward to seeing you again in Hyderabad for AROICON 2009.


